

On Monday and Tuesday this week, our junior pupils visited the Seal Squad Xplorer Exhibition at Seymour Gospel Hall. The children had a fantastic time hearing all about Septimus the seal, discovering about the species that can be seen around our Cornish coastline and also the importance of protecting their marine habitat.



Our reception children also had an animal encounter, of a different kind, when the Screech Owl Sanctuary visited us on Thursday along with three of their owls (a Barn Owl, Tawny Owl & Scops Owl). The children had an amazing time, and were able to take a really close look at these fascinating creatures. The children were even fortunate to have enough time to study and complete some life drawings of the owls.



Throughout the week, children from Years 1 to 6 inclusive enjoyed a free outing to the White River Cinema as part of the Into Film Festival. The children were treated to a viewing of one of three selected films. The aim of the film festival is to inspire young people to watch, understand and encourage children to have a go at making films themselves.



Meanwhile in class, our nursery children have been celebrating National Nursery Rhyme Week, singing different nursery rhymes each day. The children have then continued to explore the topic of each rhyme as part of their play, learning and development. Other topics covered in the various classes this week include number facts and number bonds, aviation pioneer Amelia Earhart, the ocean, exploring the properties of materials and World War 2, to name but a few.

We also found the time to participate in football and netball matches away to Mount Charles School on Tuesday. All teams put in a fantastic effort, well done to everyone who took part!


Reading Challenge
