Uniform Expectations Reminder

It is our policy that all children should wear school uniform when attending school. In the interests of safety, practicality and hygiene, long hair should be tied back during the day. We would also like to remind parents that your child's hair should not be dyed and hair cuts should not be shorter than a grade 2 (or include tramlines/patterns) during the school term. Nail varnish and temporary tattoos are also not permitted.

A watch and only one pair of plain, single small stud earrings are the only jewellery to be worn.

Given the changeable weather, we would also ask you to ensure your child has a coat (clearly labelled with their name) in school each day.
