

#### Time flies

Time has certainly flown over the past week, with lots happening in school.

Nursery have hosted their 'Come and play' sessions, with the children settling in really well. The children have been learning about the colour 'red' and the shape 'circle'.



Reception classes have held their transition sessions, with families joining them for lunch on Wednesday. The children have enjoyed exploring in their classroom and the outside area.



Years 1 & 1/2 have been getting to know one another, sharing their holiday experiences, working on their counting and sorting skills as well as learning how to use an iPad.

Year 3 have been busy learning about their new topic Ancient Egypt. They have created some fantastic pyramid landscapes in art.

During maths they have been identifying numbers using 100's, 10's and 1s, whilst in English they have been dictionary detectives to find the correct spelling and meaning of some tricky topic related words.



Year 5 have been learning the legend of Romulus and Remus by

acting out scenes from the story and questioning characters in the hot seat.

Whilst Year 6 have been exploring science learning about lung capacity, and also studying the topic of WW2.





It has been really pleasing to see how well the children have been settling in to school in this first week back. Keep up the great work!

### Accelerated reading

If you have a child in Year 4,5 or 6, you may have been wondering why they haven't had reading books this week.

We are pleased to share with you that from next week, we will start to use Accelerated Reader.

Accelerated Reader aims to engage and motivate pupils to improve their reading skills. Your child will read a book and subsequently take an online quiz to check their understanding of the book they have read. They will then receive immediate feedback, which will be reviewed by their teacher, and reading suggestions will be provided based on how your child has scored.

This is a very exciting development for us, and hope the children will enjoy and engage in this new fun method of learning too.

#### **Behaviour:**
