The Eden Project, Thursday 4th April 6pm – 8pm

Dear Parents of Year 4,

Over the past few years, the schools involved in the St. Austell Learning Community (STALC, now known as the Bay Learning Partnership), have come together at the Hall For Cornwall to present large scale music and dance productions based on a common theme. These productions have showcased the talent contained within the primary and secondary schools in the St. Austell Bay area, bringing pupils and staff together to create amazing shows.

The exciting news is that we have secured the Eden Project as the venue for this year's event on Thursday 4th April (6- 8pm) and your child has been selected to represent their school. This will be a unique community occasion, supported by 12 schools across the St. Austell area, and the audience will have sole access to the Eden Project during the course of the two-hour performance. The theme for the production will be 'Invisible Worlds' to coincide with the launch of Eden's new permanent display that reveals the world beyond our senses: too big, too small, too fast, too slow, too far away in space and time. Performances will take place at venues around the Eden Project and the audience will be able to move between these venues in a 'mini festival' style, with Eden's catering facilities open for the duration of the event.

On the day of the performance we will transport your child to the Eden Project in the afternoon for rehearsals but they will need to be collected from the venue after the concert at 8pm by a pre-agreed adult.

Those parents who have attended past shows at the Hall for Cornwall will be aware of the high quality of the performances and what a fantastic experience it is for our children to be part of such a large scale production. We are therefore writing to all parents of pupils involved for an initial 'expression of interest' for tickets in order for the organisers to gauge the level of ticket sales to expect. Unlike the Hall for Cornwall, there will be no limits set on the number of tickets per family and we have been able to secure a lower price for this event - £8.00 per ticket (compared to £11 at the HfC).

We would appreciate it if you could complete the consent form on ParentPay and also confirm how many tickets you may be interested in purchasing by Monday 11th February.

This is an exciting opportunity for local schools to collaborate and be part of a wonderful experience. We look forward to hearing from you.
