This week has been science week with the children celebrating all things science. Our chosen topic has been Space, as this year marks the 50th anniversary of the first humans landing on the Moon. We were very fortunate to have a planetarium brought in to school, where the children received a truly immersive experience learning about our solar system and star constellations.

On Friday the school was painted red, as we hosted a non uniform day and the pupils wore red to raise funds for Comic Relief's Red Nose Day.

The morning started with the children participating in the BBC Cornwall Move N Groove, which was filmed by the BBC. Sandy Hill were fortunate to be one of the schools included in the BBC Spotlight news that evening and we were thrilled to see some of our children feature in the footage at the end of the show.





Each class has studied a variety of science related themes, learning facts about scientists, conducting experiments investigating floatation, material absorbency, forces and rocket travel as well as lunar landings. It has been wonderful to see the children so captivated whilst learning.

Thank you to everyone who baked cakes and supported the event, it was lovely to see you all and have the opportunity to meet up. Active 30:30

At Sandy Hill, our aim is that children who attend our school are active for 1 hour each day, following the UK's Chief Medical Officer's advise, 30 minutes of which should be during the school day. The Youth Sport Trust call this the 'Active 30:30'.

At playtime and lunchtime, children have the opportunity to take part in playtime games led by staff, team games organised by Mr Allen, dancing, skipping and hula-hooping, in addition to PE. Mr Allen also leads extra sports sessions for children during the school day.

We encourage families and children to be as active as possible outside of school time to achieve their hour per day. The physical and mental health benefits of being active are directly related; the educational impact of being active is also scientifically proven.

Many things that you can do to stay active locally are free and Cornwall is a fantastic outdoors location. For example, a walk to and from school each day could help achieve the extra 30 minutes straight away.
