

### ART DAY



Last Friday, the whole school took part in an Art based focussed day from Nursery up to Year 6. Each class studied a different country/artist and spent the day learning, researching, sketching, painting and building to produce some amazing art work!







### Art Day Y R/I

We looked at the artist John Dyer who is from Cornwall. We talked about his work and paintings, that are from all over Cornwall like St Michaels Mount and The Eden Project. We took a photo of one of his harbour scenes and re-created it on the board using bright vivid colours. We chose to paint houses, seagulls, flowers and Boats.







#### Year 5 Art Day

Year 5 had a brilliant Art day last Friday. We looked at Africa and Tinga Tinga Art, which is named after the man who created it. This style of art work is very colourful and vibrant.

The children each produced several amazing pieces of art work based around animals and tribal people of Africa. We carefully blended paints to give African themed backgrounds. Once dry we sketched out our designs and finally painted them. The results were amazing!

A great day, lots of fun and superb work created. Well done Year 5.





Year 3 had a day discovering the beautiful African island of Mauritius which is located in the Indian Ocean. It is a country known for its vibrantly coloured art. Mauritius is a country that is diverse in culture and religion. The republic's motto is "Star and Key of the Indian Ocean" and you can see why from our artwork.

We have used chalk pastels to create multi-coloured seascapes that reflect the colours that can be seen from the shores of the island's lagoon beaches. We used blending to create delicate tones that catch the eye.





Art Day Year 4

We were learning about the authentic artwork produced in Australia.

During the day the children were split into 4 teams, each with a particular focus for that day. In the morning, the children researched their focus, gathering ideas and initial designs for their creations.

Across the afternoon the children worked on producing their creations and refined their designs.

We enjoyed learning about Picasso and how he used different colours when he was happy or sad. He loved to draw people and especially his family and himself. We used photographs of ourselves and then added different facial. features from our friends to make our Picasso styled pictures







#### Art Day Year 1/2

We had a fantastic day learning about the U.K and Turner Award Winner Damien Hirst. Throughout the morning we recreated three of his most famous pieces of Art. We created our very own butterfly kaleidoscope, dot art and a piece of spin art. A great day was had by all looking at modern art and exploring how different colours made us feel.







#### Art Day Nursery

John Dyer is a Cornish artist who paints Cornish landscapes and his work is internationally appreciated. Rather than trying to paint what he sees. John tries to capture the "essence" of his subject. From swopping seagulls, bobbing boats and exploding fireworks John paints a true picture of Cornish life.







#### Art Day Year 2

As part of the art day on Friday, year 2 learnt all about Japan. We made Japanese fans with Japanese writing, made butterflies using origami and created Japanese dolls and fish kites. In Literacy we wrote a factfile about Japan and in maths we solved Japanese Sudoku puzzles. Our resulting display looks fantastic!







### Art Day Year 6

Year 6 enjoyed learning facts about Brazil and also about a Brazilian artist 'Romero Britto'. We had great fun making parrots and toucans out of newspaper and tissue paper and then hanging them in a tree.

### Admissions for Reception - September 2016

Parents and carers of children who are due to start their primary school education in September 2016 are being reminded of the deadline for applying for a school place.

All applications for reception children (i.e. those who were born between 01 September 2011 and 31 August 2012) must be submitted by 23.59 pm on 15 January 2016.

Parents still need to apply for a school place even if their child currently attends a school's nursery or preschool setting or they have expressed an interest in attending the school.
