Summer 1 Topic: *Traditional Tales*

<i>Literacy/Communication and Language</i>	<p>Practise name writing.</p> <p>Can you have a go at retelling a traditional tale story such as, 'The Three Little Pigs' – 'The Gingerbread Man' – 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'</p> <p>Can you name the different parts of a book?</p>		
<i>Mathematics</i>	<p>Can you go on a 3d shape hunt in your garden and around your home?</p> <p>Can you have a go at solving real world maths problems. For example, Can you count out 8 pieces of apple so you and your friend both have the same amount?</p>		
<i>Expressive Arts and Design</i>	<p><u>Paper plate traditional tale character</u></p> <p>Can you choose a character from a traditional tale and create a mask of them using a paper plate?</p>	<p><u>Baking a Gingerbread Man</u></p> <p>Can you have a go at baking your own Gingerbread Man? Hopefully your Gingerbread Man won't run away like the one in the story!</p>	<p><u>Junk model story character</u></p> <p>Could you have a go at using junk modelling materials to create your very own traditional story character?</p>
<i>Understanding of the World</i>	<p><u>Exploring forces</u></p> <p>Can you have a go at learning about the different forces you can feel when you do things at home? For example, can you demonstrate pushing and pulling along a toy car or train?</p>	<p><u>Exploring different natural materials</u></p> <p>Now the weather is improving, can you have a go at finding different natural materials outside and comparing them?</p>	<p><u>Around the World</u></p> <p>Can you talk with your family about different countries around the world? Maybe you have family or friends who live in a different country?</p>
<i>Physical Development</i>	<p><u>Throwing and Catching</u></p> <p>Can you have a go at practising how to throw and catch a ball?</p>	<p><u>Scissor Skills</u></p> <p>Can you have a go at cutting out different 2d shapes using your scissor skills?</p>	<p><u>Eating independently</u></p> <p>Can you have a go at practising to use a knife and fork when you eat your food?</p>
