During the first half of the Spring term we have been valuing the importance of Art. As our fine motor control has developed enough to handle and manipulate tools with increasing co-ordination

and control we have been enhancing the children's skills within their Art work, teaching them artistic techniques. We appreciated the Artist Dennis Wojtkiewicz who creates highly detailed paintings of fruit cross sections. We then had a go at creating observational drawings of fruit using black pen. We then used professional watercolour paint to infill our detailed outlines. The children were then given opportunities to practise their taught skills independently during 'continuous provision' (choosing time). The children were given provocations such as; flowers, plants and historic artefacts to draw and paint. These skills we will revisit and build upon for the remainder of this year. Children, through art activities, are able to justify their ideas and express the situations they have experienced clearly. Especially though drawing, they can exchange ideas and discuss their art's outcome. This stimulates them to talk, articulate their thoughts and practise their communication skills.
