Before the glitter, magic and sparkle of Christmas kicks in we will be noticing the seasonal changes happening around us. As the temperature falls and the darker nights are upon us, we will discuss the signs and events around the Winter season. From next week, we will begin to focus our learning around the story, 'Whatever Next!' by Jill Murphy - look out for Miss Polmounter reading the story that will be uploaded to Tapestry so that the children can enjoy the story at home.





The Nursery children have been doing a fantastic job at learning to write their name every morning after their selfregistration. We do our name writing everyday as it is a vital skill needed to support school readiness. You can help to support your child at home with their name writing by practicing letter formation and promoting the correct pencil grip.



The tripod pencil grip is the desired grip to be able to hold a pencil most effectively. There are a range of fun activities you can do at home with your child to support their fine motor skills in order to support their ability to hold a pencil. Some examples of fine motor skill activities include, making play-dough, threading beads and cutting and sticking activities. All these activities will help to support your child's fine motor muscle development, therefore promoting effective early writing.
