It has been an extremely exciting and busy time in Year 2 this half-term!

We fully immersed ourselves into our Fire topic and enjoyed becoming historians; using clues from the past to find out about The Great Fire of London. To help us understand how the fire spread so quickly, we made Tudor houses and recreated The Great Fire with the help of St Austell Community Fire station. It was a fantastic experience and we even got to go onto the fire engine! In music/PE (dance) we appraised a piece of music and worked in small groups to choreograph a short dance to represent the The Great Fire. The children enjoyed performing their dances to the rest of the class.

Maple and Willow Class thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to visit White River cinema and watch Paw Patrol. It was extremely exciting to walk into St Austell with the rest of KS1 and all children proved themselves to be real Sandy Stars!

Year 2 also worked incredibly hard throughout this term rehearsing for their nativity 'Hey Ewe'. All the children were absolutely amazing in the performance performing their lines and songs beautifully and should be very proud of themselves!

We have rounded off the term immersing ourselves into a variety of Christmas crafts including making Cornish themed Christmas cards for our local care homes. What busy term and we are all excited to get going again in January with our new topic 'Sensational Safari!'

Year 3 - Ash and Elm Classes



Year 3 have had an exciting, fun-filled half term learning all about Ancient Egypt!

In English, the children have learnt about instruction writing. As well as looking at different examples of instructions, the children also had to identify the features they have (including subheadings and expanded noun phrases) and how to use these within their own work Using all of the skills they had been taught, the children did a fantastic job of writing their own set of instructions about how to build a pyramid.

Within maths, whilst also doing weekly arithmetic tests, we have focussed on addition and subtraction. The children have been working extremely hard and have learnt new methods to work out answers, using both abstract and pictorial representations. Now, the children are beginning to transfer these methods to multiplication.

Throughout our history lessons, the children have been really enthused to become historians and learn all about Ancient Egypt. Putting their skills to the test, the children had to follow instructions to create a piece of papyrus paper. Once they had successfully created the paper, the children were tasked with the challenge to write a sentence using hieroglyphics. On top of this, the children developed their research skills. by researching all about the different pharaohs of this ancient civilisation, To finish of their Ancient Egypt topic, the children have created their own pyramid and learnt about how they were made and why they were successful.

In science, the children have been learning about animals including humans, focussing on our diet and what a healthy diet consists of. They have learnt that humans need the correct amount of nutrients which come from the food that we eat. Because of this, the children designed their own meals, which included their favourite foods, and then compared them to their peers. Using this information, they then created a graph to show what type of food was the most popular in the class.

Recently, we have been rehearsing our Christmas performance. The children have worked tirelessly to learn the lyrics to all the songs as well as lines to their part where required. The children showed fantastic resilience and were very supportive of one another when rehearsing.

We hope you have a lovely Christmas and look forward to welcoming you all back in the New Year!







Year 4 - Beech and Sycamore Classes



Year 4 have had a wonderful, jam packed half term! We started the term with a fantastic Diwali dance workshop as part of our R.E topic of Hinduism. This was a great way to introduce the new learning. We commemorated Remembrance Day by reading the book, Where the Poppies Now Grow, by Hilary Robinson and the children then created some beautiful water colour poppy wreaths.

In English, we have been writing escape stories in the style of our English text, Escape from Pompeii. Our innovated story was titled, Escape from Lapland and our final Big Write was about somewhere local to us: Escape From Charlestown. The children have been very imaginative and loved creating a story about somewhere so close to home.

In topic lessons, we have continued to find out about the Rotten Romans and what the Celtic tribes did to try to protect Britain. The children have been making their own books on Book Creator about the life of Queen Boudicca from the Iceni Tribe - you can check them out by using their Wonde login details. We were also lucky enough to take part in the Into Film Festival where we watched The Addams Family at the cinema earlier this term.

In recent weeks, we have been rehearsing for our Christmas performance where the children have put an incredible effort into learning song lyrics, dances and lines with Sycamore Class - they have collaborated brilliantly; Miss Heather, Mr Couch and the Year 4 staff are extremely proud of their hard work, dedication and performance!

Year 5 have had a fantastic start to the year and completed some incredible learning this term. Every child in the class has shown that they are truly Sandy Hill STARS by demonstrating our school values by being: supportive, thinkers, aspirational, resilient and self-motivated.

In maths, we have learnt all about place value, addition and subtraction and multiplication and division. We have also continued to build on our fundamental arithmetic knowledge from Year 4 and applied it during our regular arithmetic practice sessions. We are really proud of how our skills are progressing!

Across our writing, we have used our Vikings topic as a stimulus. We have written some fantastic recounts of Vikings raids, studied Viking myths and legends and also created our own mythical monsters. In poetry, we have studied the use of similes, metaphors and personification to enhance our writing.

During our guided reading lessons, we have enjoyed reading extracts from a range of texts and applying our comprehension skills. Some of our favourites include: The Windrush Child, When We Got Lost in Dreamland, A Christmas Carol and The Jabberwocky. We have also thoroughly enjoyed sharing and discussing our class novel, 'The Boy at the Back of the Class' by Onjali Rauf.

Across our afternoons, we have been learning all about materials and their properties in Science, gymnastics and netball in PE, Britain's National Parks in Geography and created some fantastic 3D creations in DT.

We have also had special visits from Olympic Gold Medallist Calum Jarvis and local designer Tony Plant.

Year 6 - Oak Class



Resilience, self-motivation, aspiration - just three of the words to describe the outstanding attitude of our children in Oak Class (Year 6).

In what has been a busy term, the children have been working hard so that they can remember more and do more. In mathematics, the children's fluency and procedural knowledge has increased significantly with children striving to beat their personal best. In writing, the children have enjoyed composing a number of texts, including: a letter back to Carrie (as mum), a story magical setting and an Invictus style poem. In reading, the children have been developing their retrieval and inference skills to support them with understanding a wide variety of texts, including our class book 'Goodnight Mr Tom.'

In the wider curriculum, under the topic of World War 2, children have been developing their historical and chronological awareness, using primary and secondary sources to support their understanding of this period of time. From locational knowledge in geography, netball and gymnastics in PE, the dilemma of Science and Christianity in RE to digital literacy in computing, greetings in Spanish and understanding relationships in PSHE - it is safe to say the children have had a wide variety of learning with a large dose of Cultural Capital thrown in.

Our Christmas production 'Bah Humbug!' has been very fun to put together and it has been a pleasure to see how the children have learned their lines, practiced their dance moves and enjoyed singing the songs. Thank you for all your support in putting this together for the children - it is greatly appreciated.



Tapestry is an easy-to-use and secure online learning journal that helps staff and families across Aspire academies celebrate their children's learning and development in Nursery and Reception Class.

As parents, the first day of handing over your child to the care of another can be an emotional time. As your child adjusts to experiences without you at their childminder, nursery, or school, parents continue to want to share in these times.

Tapestry facilitates this by enabling a personal journal, or diary, to build over time. Photographs, videos and notes of special moments are not only recorded, but can be made available regularly and often immediately to you via your iPhone or Android App.

Learning Together

Google Classroom -Enhancing connections with learners from school, from home, or on the go.



Think of Google Classroom as your child's digital link to learning. Teachers use Google Classroom to share resources, links and assignments with pupils during lessons at school across the curriculum.

KS2 teachers will use Google Classroom to share homework with students and parents. It is a great tool for keeping up to date with your child's learning.

SEND



What is SEND?

SEND means Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. Some children may find learning more challenging than others and may need additional support to help them achieve their full potential. At Sandy Hill, all children are valued, respected and welcomed to our school whatever their additional educational need. Our SENDCo, Mrs Carter, works alongside teachers, pupils and their families to consider the best route of support to help children with SEND to access the curriculum.

How do we decide what type of support children receive?

Every child's needs are different, and their needs may change over time. We identify children's needs through a combination of observations in class, outcomes of assessments and through discussions with parents. There are 4 main areas of SEND: Communication and Interaction, Cognition and Learning, Social, Emotional and Mental Health and Sensory and/or Physical.

How do I know if my child needs SEND support?

We will discuss your child's needs with you in order to work together to decide the best route of support. Often, this will include making adaptions to their learning in the classroom but can also sometimes mean accessing support from external agencies or specialists, e.g. Speech and Language therapists.

Information & Support

HOW TO ACCESS A FOODBANK:

1. Get in touch with your nearest foodbank

Either by telephone or email and explain your situation. The foodbank will be able to tell families which referral agencies they work with in their area and how they can get a voucher.

2. Arrange a visit to the referral agency specified by the foodbank

Families will discuss being issued with a foodbank voucher if appropriate.

3. Take the voucher to the nearest foodbank centre

Once at the foodbank, families will be met by trained volunteers who will sit down with them to discuss their situation and provide a food parcel.

Volunteers meet clients over a warm drink or free hot meal and are able to signpost people to agencies able to solve the longer-term problem.

Please note that families must have a food voucher in order to receive help from the foodbank.
